Mr. Nigro entered on duty with the FBI as a Special Agent on December 6, 1987. Following training at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia, he was assigned to the Houston Field Office, where he served for approximately 18 months. During his tenure in Houston, he worked on an Organized Crime/Drug Squad.

In October 1988, Mr. Nigro was transferred to the New York Field Office where he served for six years. During his tenure in New York, he was assigned to Italian Organized Crime (IOC)/Drug Squad.

In August 1994, Mr. Nigro was appointed as an Assistant Legal Attache` (ALAT), Legat, Rome. He reported to Rome in January 1995. As ALAT, he managed all organized crime and drug investigations for Italy and approximately 20 other foreign countries covered by the FBI Legat Rome Office. He served at the American Embassy in Rome for approximately three and a half years.

In October 1998, Mr. Nigro was transferred to the La Cosa Nostra (LCN)/Italian Organized Crime (IOC)/Labor Racketeering Unit, Organized Crime Section, Criminal Investigative Division, at FBI Headquarters.

In February 2000, Mr. Nigro was named Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) of the Special Operations Group (SOG), Boston Field Office. He reported to Boston in May 2000. For approximately four years, he provided managerial oversight as well as administrative and logistical support for physical surveillance assets and the aviation program.

In April 2004, Mr. Nigro was selected by the FBI Boston Executive Management to establish a Field Intelligence Group (FIG). As the supervisor of the Intelligence squad Mr. Nigro provided managerial oversight for Agents, Intelligence Analysts and Language Analysts.

In February 2008, Mr. Nigro was designated as the Counterintelligence (CI) Strategic Partnership Coordinator for the FBI Boston Division. In his current role, Mr. Nigro engages in collaborative efforts with private sector entities and stakeholders of targeted technologies. He leverages resources of private industry and academia to work with the FBI to effectively harden the target around U.S. technologies and Research & Development. He prepares and conducts classified and unclassified briefings for private sector entities and academia on the topic of Counterintelligence, Security Awareness, Economic Espionage, Insider Threat and Intellectual Property/Trade Secrets Protection.
